## **LEGISLATIVE UPDATE**

This quarter's legislative update is provided by Dr. Elizabeth Marsicano.

Missouri State Legislative Update: Close of Session 2025
The Missouri General Assembly's 2025 session concluded in May with limited healthcare-related legislative progress. The Missouri Legislature passed 39 bills this year. Of those, 16 were spending bills and 23 were related to policy.

Bills That Failed to Pass. Of Interest:

SB 230 represents a significant missed opportunity for prior authorization reform. This bill would have established a 90% approval threshold for prior authorization requirements, meaning health carriers could not require prior authorization from providers unless less than 90% of their previous requests were approved during the evaluation period, significantly reducing administrative burden and improving patient care. The bill would also have prohibited payment denials for services that had prior authorization approval, unless providers made knowing misrepresentations or failed to substantially perform the service.

SB 230 has been proposed in similar forms over multiple legislative sessions indicating sustained legislative interest in prior authorization reform that unfortunately did not succeed this year. Hopefully the next legislative session will

SB 383 represented another missed opportunity for physician employment mobility reform. This bill would have established reasonable limits on physician non-compete agreements, restricting them to no more than 365 days and a 50-mile radius from the physician's office. The bill specifically exempted nonprofit healthcare entities from these restrictions, focusing reform on for-profit employers.

The Missouri GI society partners with the Missouri Medical Association and continues monitoring these legislative developments as they affect practice operations, patient access, and provider reimbursement rates across all specialties, including gastroenterology.

**Action Items:** Contact your state legislators to advocate for reintroduction of both SB 230's prior authorization reforms and SB 383's physician non-compete protections in the next legislative session.

A. Pneumatic dilation


B. Lower esophageal sphincter botulinum toxin injection
