# Member Spotlight Dr. Sheetal Sharma


Dr. Sharma is the current President of the Missouri GI Society. He is an Advanced Therapeutic Gastroenterology Faculty (EUS/ERCP) at Mercy Clinic and Hospital in Washington, Missouri. He is also Section Chief of Gastroenterology and Chairman of the Mercy-wide GI Specialty Council.
