### **Program Overview**

Primary biliary cholangitis (PBC) is a chronic autoimmune liver disease most prevalent in North America, affecting about 39.2 per 100,000 individuals in the US. It predominantly occurs in middle-aged women and is often difficult to diagnose due to nonspecific symptoms. While ursodeoxycholic acid (UDCA) remains first-line therapy, updated guidelines emphasize individualized treatment to improve liver health, delay transplant, and enhance quality of life. This interactive, case-based webcast will explore recent updates in treatment guidelines and clinical strategies to improve diagnosis, personalize management, and reduce disease burden and transplant needs.

# **LEGISLATIVE UPDATE**

This quarter's legislative update is provided by Dr. Elizabeth Marsicano.

Missouri gastroenterologists operate at the intersection of science, patient advocacy, and regulatory oversight. Recent legislative and regulatory developments directly influence how patients are screened, diagnosed, and treated for digestive diseases, and how practices are staffed and funded. Screening policies, scope of practice, administrative burdens, prior authorizations, Medicaid, and reimbursement are only some of the policies being decided.

As Mr. Jacob Scott, the MSMA's Director of legislative affairs mentioned "Too often, physicians hesitate to get involved in politics...in Jefferson city what speaks loudest is <u>engagement</u>—resources...we want a healthcare system built on quality." Now more than ever, physicians' practices are being shaped at state and federal levels. Engaging in the discussion is critical for both ourselves and our patients. - **Features:** It offers scripts with talking points, tracks your progress, and now includes topics for state-level legislatures in some areas.
- Availability: Available for both iOS and Android.

### Resistbot https:resist.bot

- How it works: You can text "Resist" to 50409 to begin. The service will guide you through writing a letter, and it will then convert your message into a fax, email, or physical letter to send to your representatives.
- **Features:** It can send messages to members of Congress, Governors, and state legislators. You can also create campaigns to encourage others to send similar messages.
- **Availability:** Accessible via text message and a website. PolitiCall App

### **CASE OF THE QUARTER**

A 54-year old man with decompensated cirrhosis and HRS-AKI is being treated with intravenous terlipressin and albumin. On day 4, his serum creatinine has decreased by 25% from baseline, but he develops new-onset chest pain, new hypoxia (SpO2 88%) and bibasilar crackles. EKG shows nonspecific ST changes, and chest x-ray reveals mild pulmonary edema.

Which of the following is the most appropriate next step?

A. Continue the current dose of terlipressin and increase albumin regimen, as creatinine is improving. B. Withhold terlipressin and decrease albumin infusion immediately
C. Switch to midodrine and

octreotide immediately, and continue albumin at the same dose.

D. Increase the dose of terlipressin to achieve further reduction in serum creatinine
